Keith was also a successful musician for 15 years, established an independent record label/distribution company and toured internationally. He is highly regarded as being an early pioneer of UK Rap and Hip-Hop music.

Dr Yolanda Ohene is a British neuroscientist, science communicator and co-founder of The Blackett Lab Family and the Minorities in STEM network. Working at the University of Manchester, her scientific research focuses on brain imaging, analysing pictures created using a medical imaging technique known as magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) and developing new ways to image the brain.






PhD Student and Al Researcher

Robert's background is in Biomedical Science with a focus on neuropharmacology, and his secondary area of research is in how psychedelics and BCIs can be used for therapeutic purposes. Robert was a BLAST Media Fellow in 2022 and is the youngest Black STEAM quest speaker we've ever had!

Her company, Language Waves, addresses the barriers that Black and minoritized families face when accessing Speech and Language Therapy services, offering alternative culturally and linguistically affirming services. Her approach centres language as a multimodal emancipatory tool that resists the standard language ideologies.

Dr Martin Glynn is a renowned criminologist, educator, theatre director, and dramatist with over 35 years' of experience working in criminal justice, public health, and educational settings. Martin was awarded a Winston Churchill Fellowship, spending several weeks in the city of Baltimore and Johns Hopkins University looking at issues of fatherlessness, father hunger, and father deficit amongst young Black men.


LEVEL 2
